Hordes of gigantic animals thunder through a lush valley. But more dangerous than the sharp teeth and claws of these animal predators is the boundless hostility between the human predators: Cro-Magnons and Neanderthals. Two species about to face off in a merciless struggle. It is a time of darkness pierced by one tiny ray of light: Rahan, Son of the Brave.

The adventures of Rahan were first published in comic-book form in 1969. Within months, the Stone-Age hero became a hit in Europe. In this animated series, the solitary prehistoric hunter Rahan is 16 years old. No longer a child, not yet a man. Hotheaded, proud, bursting with energy. A young man who wants "those-who-walk-upright" to live in peace one day.

Targeted at children 8-12, the series stands out for its gorgeous artwork, which conveys the primordial grandeur of these terrifying ages. Exquisitely crafted backgrounds and painstakingly rendered details elevate this series to the status of a genuine

work of art. Lighter in tone than the original comic book, the series owes a great deal of its humor to Ursus, a little creature who becomes Rahan's inseparable companion. Though his endless chattering gets on Rahan's nerves, Ursus is a faithful friend. And he also has a gift: the ability to see the invisible and detect the parallel world that lives in the spirits of nature.

This valuable "door of perception" increases Rahan's already keen power of observation. Rahan's chief mission is to achieve harmony between the Cro-Magnons and the Neanderthals. He is convinced that by pooling their resources, the two species of "those-who-walk-upright" will have a better chance of surviving. Rahan finds like-minded souls among both groups. Allies such as a blind young female shaman and, of course, the little busy-body Ursus. In a world where the only law is that of the jungle, Rahan sets an example that will reverberate throughout the ages. It is the birth of the first prehistoric hero! Rahan, son of the brave, has come to bring light to the darkest of ages.
